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Housing Resources

One of the areas where transgender and gender nonconforming people often face disparities is in housing. According to the National Center for Transgender Equality, one in five trans people have experienced housing discrimination and one in ten have experienced eviction based on gender identity (2021). This issue is significant because it affects quality of life and can lead to a decline in other health outcomes. Unequal access to housing is associated with other factors including lower mental health outcomes, food insecurity, and lower employment rates (Kirkpatrick & Tarasuk, 2011). Many trans and gender non-conforming people face discrimination in employment due to their identity, and without access to employment, many people find it hard to access housing. When people face discrimination in the process of finding housing or are unable to afford it, it often means they are unable to afford food on a regular basis, and this can lead to depression and anxiety and a decline in physical health. When people experience these barriers in accessing necessities, it makes it difficult for them to access healthcare services for regular checkups, HIV testing and cancer prevention services due to fear of discrimination and low rates of health insurance coverage because of low employment rates (Rollston, 2019). To improve the health of the community and lower disparities in housing outcomes, more protections should be put in place to address the systematic barriers experienced by transgender people.

Legal Resources

One of the main areas where transgender people are most vulnerable is under the legal system. Transgender people often face abuse and mistreatment from law enforcement officials, including police officers and prison staff. Especially among black and brown transgender women, many report being harassed by police officers in the form of intentional misgendering, placement in jails and prisons that do not match their current gender identity, and being targeted (National Center for Transgender Equality, 2021). Just in the year 2021, there have been at least 28 transgender people murdered, many of them transgender women of color (Human Rights Campaign, 2021). When it comes to the reporting of trans murders, the media often uses the wrong identity to describe the gender of the trans person killed and often uses a person's birth name instead of their chosen name in news reporting (Forestiere, 2020). To advocate for the rights of the trans community, more law organizations should provide the necessary services and more work needs to be done to recognize and pass legal protections for trans people.

Health Resources

The ability to access quality healthcare without interference or discrimination is one of the most basic human rights, along with access to food, safe housing, and education (World Health Organization, 2017). However, far too often, transgender people are put in situations where they must go without these needs being met. In most training programs for healthcare providers and other professionals, transgender healthcare is not covered, and many transgender people report feeling unsafe visiting healthcare services on a regular basis. As most healthcare providers are not trained on best practices when engaging with trans patients, many transgender people are unable to take advantage of preventive healthcare services including cancer screening, HIV and STD testing, as well as health treatment services (Safer et al, 2016). In addition, the stigma that many trans people face both within and outside of the healthcare system often leads to increased use of tobacco products and alcohol as a means of coping with the added stress (Scime, 2019). For this reason, many trans people are at increased risk of cancer and other health issues but are less likely to have access to culturally competent providers who can provide the necessary services to treat these illnesses (Safer et al, 2016). While there is limited data on the transgender community due to underreporting and misidentification of patients' identities, there are numerous social and behavioral factors which suggest that this community is experiencing major disparities in health outcomes. To shed light on the health experiences of this community, more providers and other healthcare professionals should be educated on how to provide trans-affirming healthcare and more data on this community should be collected on a regular basis.

LGBTQIA+ Common Terms*

Affirmed Gender: An individual's true gender, as opposed to their gender assigned at birth. This term should replace terms like new gender or chosen gender, which imply that an individual chooses their gender.

Agender: (pronounced ā-'jen-dər) Refers to a person who does not identify with or experience any gender.

Ally: A term used to describe someone who is actively supportive of LGBTQ people. It encompasses straight and cisgender allies, as well as those within the LGBTQ community who support each other (e.g., a lesbian who is an ally to the bisexual community).

Androgynous: Having an appearance or expression that is marked by a combination or blend of traditionally masculine and feminine characteristics. People who present androgynously can be gay, straight, cisgender, Trans, non-binary, or any sexuality or gender identity. Androgyne (pronounced an-druh-jain) is another term for an androgynous individual, although not all androgynous people identify with this term.

Aromantic: Sometimes abbreviated as aro (pronounced ā-row), the term refers to an individual who does not experience romantic attraction. Aromantic people exist on a spectrum of romantic attraction and can use terms such as gray aromantic or grayromantic to describe their place within that spectrum. Aromantic people can experience sexual attraction.

Asexual: Often called "ace" for short, asexual refers to a complete or partial lack of sexual attraction or lack of interest in sexual activity with others. Asexuality exists on a spectrum, and asexual people may experience no, little or conditional sexual attraction.

Assigned Sex: The sex assigned to an infant at birth based on the child's visible sex organs, including genitalia and other physical characteristics.

Assumed Gender: The gender assumed about an individual, based on their assigned sex as well as apparent societal gender markers and expectations, such as physical attributes and expressed characteristics.

Bi-curious: A term used to identify a person who is interested in exploring their attraction to people of a variety of genders.

Bigender: While gender is now widely understood to be a spectrum and not on a binary, this is a term used to identify a person whose gender identity encompasses two genders, (often man and woman, but not exclusively) or is moving between two genders.

Biological Sex: Refers to anatomical, physiological, genetic, or physical attributes that determine if a person is male, female, or intersex.

Biphobia: The fear and hatred of, or discomfort with, people who love and are sexually attracted to more than one gender.

Bisexual: A person emotionally, romantically or sexually attracted to more than one sex, gender or gender identity though not necessarily simultaneously, in the same way or to the same degree. Sometimes used interchangeably with pansexual.

Cisgender: A term used to describe a person whose gender identity aligns with those typically associated with the sex assigned to them at birth.

Coming Out: The process, in which a person first acknowledges, accepts and appreciates their sexual orientation or gender identity and begins to share that with others.

Deadnaming: Occurs when an individual, intentionally or not, refers to the name that a transgender or gender expansive individual used at a different time in their life.

Disclosure: A word that some people use to describe the act or process of revealing one's transgender or gender expansive identity to another person in a specific instance.

Gay: A person who is emotionally, romantically or sexually attracted to members of the same gender. Men, women and non-binary people may use this term to describe themselves.

Gender binary: A system in which gender is constructed into two strict categories of male or female. Gender identity is expected to align with the sex assigned at birth and gender expressions and roles fit traditional expectations.

Gender dysphoria: Clinically significant distress caused when a person's assigned birth gender is not the same as the one with which they identify.

Gender-expansive: A person with a wider, more flexible range of gender identity and/or expression than typically associated with the binary gender system.

Gender expression: External appearance of one's gender identity, usually expressed through behavior, clothing, body characteristics or voice, and which may or may not conform to socially defined behaviors and characteristics typically associated with being either masculine or feminine.

Gender Expression: The manner in which a person communicates about gender to others through external means such as clothing, appearance, or mannerisms. This communication may be conscious or subconscious and may or may not reflect their gender identity or sexual orientation.

Gender fluid: Describes a person who does not consistently adhere to one fixed gender and who may move among genders.

Gender identity: One's innermost concept of self as male, female, a blend of both or neither – how individuals perceive themselves and what they call themselves. One's gender identity can be the same or different from their sex assigned at birth.

Gender non-conforming: A broad term referring to people who do not behave in a way that conforms to the traditional expectations of their gender (whether cisgender or transgender), or whose gender expression does not fit neatly into a category.

Genderqueer: Genderqueer people typically reject notions of static categories of gender and embrace a fluidity of gender identity and often, though not always, sexual orientation.

Gender Roles: The strict set of societal beliefs that dictate the so-called acceptable behaviors for people of different genders, usually binary in nature.

Gender Spectrum: The concept that gender exists beyond a simple man/woman binary model (see *Gender Binary*), but instead exists on a continuum, that can include those with no gender, those whose gender fluctuates or those whose gender encompasses one or more genders.

Intersex: Intersex is the current term used to refer to people who are biologically between the medically expected definitions of male and female. This can be through variations in hormones, chromosomes, internal or external genitalia, or any combination of any or all primary and/or secondary sex characteristics.

Latinx: (Pronounced Latin-ex, la-TEEN-ex OR la-TEEN-eh) An inclusive, gender-neutral term--sometimes used in place of the gendered, binary terms Latino or Latina--used to describe a person of Latin-American origin or descent.

MSM: Men Who Have Sex with Men.

Non-Binary: a catch-all term for all individuals who gender is not exclusively 100% male or 100% female, IE - falls outside of the binary. Non-binary can be an umbrella term, to encompass people who are agender, gender-fluid, etc., or simply an identity label on its own. Some non-binary individuals do not transition, while others undergo medical, social and

hormonal transitions. Some non-binary people choose to use the more gender-neutral pronouns they/them, while others use a host of other pronouns like he or she.

Questioning: Describes those who are in a process of discovery and exploration about their sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, or a combination thereof.

Transition: A term used to refer to the process—social, legal, and/or medical—one goes through to affirm one's gender identity. This may, but does not always, include taking hormones; having surgeries
